

WHEREAS, an application for these funds was received and approved by the West Virginia Development Office; and,


WHEREAS, the Community Participation Program requires that a local government unit sponsor said application.

The Northern Appalachian Coal Mining Heritage Association (NACMHA) was established in 2000 to perpetuate the understanding of the cultural heritage of communities affected by the coal mining industry. At present we have a small museum which we are revamping, displaying mining memorabilia and we are active in the community. We are growing and our plans are to be self-supporting through memberships, museum visitor donations, etc.

NACMHA is planning its first Open House Celebration on Saturday June 7th, 2014. In addition to tours of our museum, we are planning for food, music, wine tasting, miniature golf, games and a Virtusphere - a 10ft. sphere you get inside and walk around a virtual environment (like a coal mine). The event will be held from noon to 6PM at Coal Country Miniature Golf in Fairmont, rain or shine. Our budget for this event is estimated at \$7200 and we are asking the commission for \$1500.
