Commissioner Tennant moved that the Commission contribute \$600.00 to their program and that those funds be appropriated from the Coal Severance Fund. Commissioner VanGilder seconded. President Elliott concurred.

For the record, note the Commission received from the Marion County Solid Waste Authority that the State of West Virginia Auditors Office will be performing the audit of their financial statement for the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2010 through June 30, 2012.

The Commission received the Presentation of the Petition from Country Club Estates Association to regulate or prohibit the operation of all-terrain vehicles. Douglas Shaver came before the Commission to present their request. Cannon Wadsworth also came who is the President of the Association. He went through an brief explanation as to what they are requesting in which the Home Owners Association at their annual meeting a motion was approved to have the Officers approach the Marion County Commission to enact an Ordinance to outlaw the use of ATV's and dirt bikes in the Country Club Estates.

Mr. Shaver continued with the explanation as to why they are requesting that this ordinance is needed. Mr. Shaver continued that he spoke with the Sheriff on November 5, 2012 about the situation and he was informed that because the neighborhood does not have painted lines on their roads, there is little that can be done in enforcement.

President Elliott stated that the Commission has reviewed this request and that the County does have an existing ATV Ordinance for the County property. He continued that the problem is in the enforcement. He continued that this request has been reviewed by our Attorney Chuck Shields who has some questions and an opinion.

At the annual meeting of the Country Club Estates Association (CCEA) on January 20 2013 a motion was passed which authorizes the officers to ask the Marion Country Commission to enact an ordinance to outlaw the use of recreational ATVs and Dirt bikes in Country Club Estates. Pursuant to the authorization the Homeowner's Association of Country Club Estates hereby petitions the commission to pass an ordinance to regulate the operation of all terrain vehicles within the boundaries of Country Club Estates (as outlined on the attached Map) pursuant to WV Code Chapter 17F Article 1, section §17F-1-3. Local government authority to regulate (2).


(2) Homeowner associations may petition the county commission of the county in which the area regulated by the homeowner association is located for an ordinance to regulate or prohibit the operation of all-terrain vehicles upon any street, road or avenue within the area regulated by the homeowner association. County commissions are hereby authorized, upon receipt of a petition authorized by the provisions of this section, to enact an ordinance regulating or prohibiting the operation of all-terrain vehicles.

This neighborhood begins at Country Club Road at the intersection of Club Crest and all roads and land connected to Club Crest (Hutchinson Dr, Club View Dr, Bel Manor Dr, Briarwood Terrace, GreenView Dr, Regency Dr & Eclipse Dr) and any future roads within the community, see map next page.

This petition is being brought forth by the homeowner's association because of the deterioration and damage being caused by ATV usage around the Ice's Run Water Tower located between Club View and Regency Dr, which has caused flooding to the streets and homeowners from runoff water around the tower. The ATV s are a safety issue because they are being operated at high speeds throughout the community roads which creates a safety issue for the operator, but also makes it dangerous to drive automobiles and enjoy walking when in use. The ATVs are also being driven on private property within the community that is not owned by the ATV operator.

This neighborhood seeks to retain its environment of being a quiet and desirable place to live and socialize with neighbors and friends.

Chuck Shields asked if the Ice's Run water tower is within the boundaries of your association. Mr. Shaver stated that he believed so. Chuck Shields stated that the County Commission has the authority to enact the ordinance; however the statute is not really clear as to how to go about doing it. Mr. Shields asked if this is supported by a majority of its residents. Mr. Shaver answered in the affirmative. Mr. Shields asked if they had minutes that they could share with the Commission. Mr. Shaver answered that they did and could give the Commission a copy of those minutes. Chuck Shields stated that he would like to see a petition of signatures of the members of the association that they support this ordinance at least a majority of its members to present to the Commission. In addition Chuck Shields asked that they specifically state what you are asking for in regards to an absolute prohibition of their use or a limitation. Chuck Shields asked if those riding these ATV's are members of the Association. Mr. Shaver stated that he believed so. County Attorney Chuck Shields stated that he believed it would be appropriate to have a majority of its members signing a petition to have this ordinance enacted. **President Elliott agreed** with that comment.

Commissioner VanGilder asked if the roads were owned by the Association or the State. Cannon Wadsworth stated that they are orphaned roads.
