**ORDER ADMITTING COPY OF
WILL TO PROBATE**

On the 10th day of April, 2013, came the Petitioner, Donald Downs, in person and by his attorney, Jeffery D. Taylor, all pursuant to the verified Petition for Probate in Solemn Form, filed herein, and set down for a hearing this date, by prior Order of the Commission.

The Heirs at Law of Fannie L. Robinson were notified of this proceeding by First Class mail, and additionally, notice of this proceeding was given to all known and unknown heirs by publication in the Fairmont Times-West Virginian. In response to such notifications there were no appearances in opposition to the Petition for Probate.

Whereupon, the Commission proceeded to hear the testimony of the Petitioner, Donald Downs, the arguments and representations of the attorney for the Petitioner, and upon mature consideration of which the Commission makes the following findings of fact:

1. Fannie L. Robinson died in Marion County, West Virginia, on January 14, 1992.
2. As of the date of the hearing, no estate for Fannie L. Robinson had been established in any county in West Virginia.
3. The Estate of Fannie L. Robinson is possessed of certain assets which have not been administered since her death.
4. The Petitioner presented to the Commission a copy of a document purporting to be of the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson, dated December 9, 1974.

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5. Upon the evidence presented, the document offered for probate, satisfies the factual requirements for a properly executed will, that is to say:

- A. That Fannie L. Robinson was of legal age.
- B. That Fannie L. Robinson demonstrated a testamentary intent and was of sound mind and disposing memory.
- C. That the Will was in writing.
- D. That the purported will was signed by Fannie L. Robinson
- E. That the purported will was signed in the presence of at least two (2) Competent witnesses, and properly attested as required by law.

6. Upon the evidence presented, the document offered for probate was not revoked after its execution by Fannie L. Robinson.

7. Upon the evidence presented, the original of the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson presented for probate by the Petitioner has been lost, suppressed or destroyed.

8. Upon the evidence presented, the loss, suppression, or destruction of the original of the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson, presented for probate by the Petitioners, resulted from mistake, inadvertence and/or the acts of third parties, not the testatrix.

9. The contents of the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson are plain from the fact of the photocopy of the document, and such contents are made a part of this Order by this express reference thereto, and incorporated herein by reference.

Upon such facts, the Commission makes the following conclusions of law:

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1. To establish a lost or destroyed will, the proponent of the copy of the document must prove by clear and convincing evidence the will's prior existence in proper legal form, its contents and its loss or destruction.

2. The presentation to the Commission of a duly executed photocopy of the Will executed on December 9, 1974, and the evidence adduced concerning the photocopy, satisfies the legal requirements for the Probate of a photocopy of the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson.

It is therefore ORDERED:

1. The photocopy of the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson, dated December 9, 1974, and attached to this Order, is hereby established as the Last Will and Testament of Fannie L. Robinson, deceased of this County.

2. The Clerk of the Marion County Commission shall admit such photocopy to probate as attached to a duly attested copy of this order.

3. The administration of the Estate of Fannie L. Robinson shall proceed before the Commission upon the directions of the Last Will and Testament, by the Executor set forth therein.

4. The heirs at law of Fannie L. Robinson are reserved their objections and exceptions to the actions of the Commission.

**ORDER OF INTENT TO
CONSOLIDATE PRECINCTS 67 AND 68**

WHEREAS, the Marion County Commission pursuant to West Virginia Code Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 5, shall utilize Precincts for the basic territorial unit; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission shall divide each Magisterial District of the County into election Precincts, shall number the Precincts, shall determine and establish the boundaries thereof, and shall designate one voting place in each Precinct which shall be established as nearly as possible at the point most convenient for the voters of the Precinct; and

WHEREAS, PURSUANT TO West Virginia Code Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 7, the County Commission of any County may change the boundaries of any Precinct within such County or divide any Precinct into two or more Precincts or consolidate two or more Precincts into one or change the location of any polling place whenever the public convenience may require it; and

WHEREAS, the Marion County Commission must respect House and Senate lines that were adjusted during redistricting after the last Decennial Census; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to West Virginia code Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 7, the County Commission which is considering changes as noted above must adopt an order of intent to do so and run a Class II legal advertisement in the publication which covers the Precinct (s) area (s); and

WHEREAS, the County Commission did adopt an order of intent to Consolidate Precincts 67 and 68 to be known as Precinct 68;

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The descriptions and map showing the Precinct 68 as follows:

BEGINNING AT A POINT IN EAST MAIN STREET AND THE CENTER OF BALTIMORE STREET, THENCE WITH BALTIMORE STREET AND BALTIMORE STREET EXTENDED TO A POINT IN THE CORPORATION LINE OF MANNINGTON AND LINE OF PRECINCT 78; THENCE WITH THE CORPORATION LINE AND PRECINCT 78 COUNTER CLOCKWISE TO THE CENTER LINE OF PYLE'S FORK, CORNER TO PRECINCTS 66 AND 68 IN THE LINE OF PRECINCT 72; THENCE WITH THE CENTER LINE OF PYLE'S FORK DOWN STREAM AND WITH PRECINCT 66 TO THE MOUTH OF PYLE'S FORK IN THE CENTER LINE OF BUFFALO CREEK, NEAR CLARKSBURG AND BUFFALO STREETS, CORNER; THENCE WITH THE CENTER LINE OF BUFFALO CREEK UP STREAM TO THE CORPORATION LINE OF MANNINGTON, WEST OF SUMMIT DRIVE, IN THE LINE OF PRECINCT 78; THENCE WITH CORPORATION LINE OF MANNINGTON AND PRECINCT 78 EASTERLY TO A LINE BETWEEN SYCAMORE ADDITION AND HOMEWOOD ADDITION CORNER OF PRECINCT 69; THENCE WITH A LINE NORTHERLY BETWEEN SYCAMORE ADDITION AND HOMEWOOD ADDITION AND PRECINCT 69 TO BUFFALO CREEK; THENCE WITH BUFFALO CREEK UP STREAM TO AND BALTIMORE STREET EXTENDED; THENCE LEAVING BUFFALO CREEK WITH AND BALTIMORE STREET EXTENDED TO THE PLACE BEGINNING.

TO BE KNOWN AS PRECINCT 68

POLLING PLACE: MANNINGTON CITY HALL

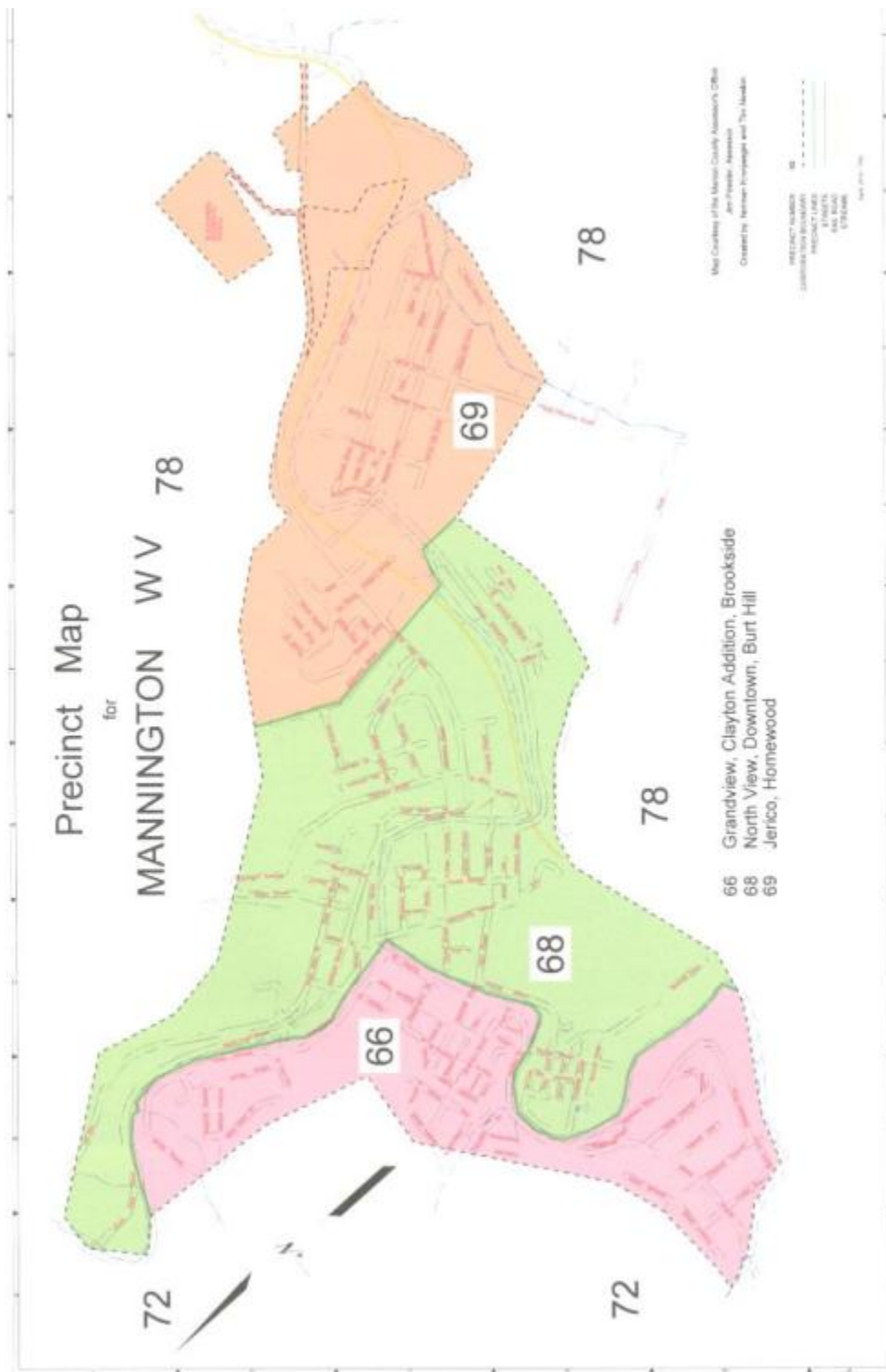
