



This day came Wesbanco Bank Inc., Fairmont, Marion County, West Virginia, a West Virginia corporation, a bank created, organized and doing business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of West Virginia, with its banking house and principal place of business in the City of Fairmont, Marion County West Virginia and requested of the Marion County Commission, pursuant to a Resolution passed by the Board of Directors of the Wesbanco Bank Inc., at a meeting of said Board held on the 18th day of April, 2013, that it be permitted to qualify as a County Depository for the fiscal year beginning on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of July, 2013 and ending the 31<sup>st</sup> day of June, 2014; and that it be permitted to avail itself of the provisions of Chapter 7, Article 5, Section 3, of the Code of West Virginia, as amended, by depositing with the County Commission of this County, in lieu of the execution of bond, interest-bearing securities of the United States of America or their equivalent as provided for in said Act to secure the deposits of public funds made by the Sheriff and treasurer of this County in said depository.

And it appearing to the Commission that the said Wesbanco Bank Inc., a bank created, organized and doing business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of West Virginia, with its banking house and principal place of business in the City of Fairmont, Marion County, West Virginia, has elected to and has deposited collateral security to secure the County Commission in public funds so deposited in said county depository instead of executing bond to secure such deposit, which said collateral security was deposited with a Trustee as provided by law under and by virtue of a certain agreement made and entered into between the Sheriff and Treasurer of Marion County, for and on behalf of Marion County and said Wesbanco Bank Inc., a bank created, organized and doing business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of West Virginia, with its banking house and principal place of business in the City of Fairmont, Marion County, West Virginia, which said agreement is in writing, is attached hereto to be filed in the Clerk's Office of this Commission, to which reference is here made.

And it now appearing to the Commission that said agreement and the collateral security deposited therewith are each and all sufficient security to indemnify this Commission against loss by reason of the deposit of public funds in said depository and that said agreement and the securities thereunder deposited will be sufficient security to this Commission for funds deposited in said depository, and that the Prosecuting Attorney has approved said agreement and said securities, the Commission does hereby consent that the agreement aforesaid, herein before entered into between the Sheriff and Treasurer of this County and Wesbanco Bank Inc., be, and the same is hereby approved as and for the Agreement between this Commission and Wesbanco



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Bank Inc., in the City of Fairmont, Marion County, West Virginia, for and during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014; and that the securities so deposited by said Wesbanco Bank Inc., as they are now here called by this Commission as such; and it is further ordered that said agreement and the collateral security therewith deposited shall be in force as the agreement and security of said county depository when the above-named Wesbanco Bank Inc., shall adopt and file with this Commission a copy of the minutes of the Board of Directors of said Wesbanco Bank Inc., stating it has agreed to become a county depository therewith, shall be the agreement aforesaid, and the collateral security deposited therewith, shall be the agreement and security deposited therewith, shall be the agreement and security of such depository of public funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014.



Dear County Official:

I am pleased to notify you that on June 13, 2013, the Department of the Interior issued payments to eligible local governments under the Payments in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) program. The PILT program compensates local jurisdictions for Federal lands administered by agencies within the Department and on behalf of the U.S. Forest Service and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. The PILT payments may be used for any governmental purpose, including important community services such as emergency response, public schools, and roads. Since counties and other local jurisdictions are prohibited from taxing Federal lands, annual PILT payments help to defray costs associated with maintaining services that support these lands within their boundaries.

The PILT program is authorized by the Payments in Lieu of Taxes Act, 31 U.S.C. 6901-6907, as amended. The PILT Act prescribes the formula that is used to compute the annual payments based on per acre and population variables, which are annually adjusted for inflation and census data. Prior year Federal payments under certain revenue sharing programs are deducted in formulating the payment amounts. These amounts are reported by your State through an annual reporting process. A provision in the PILT Act provides that temporary payments be made to compensate for recent additions to the National Park System and the National Forest Wilderness areas.

The Emergency Economic Stabilization Act of 2008 (P.L. 110-343) authorized full funding for the PILT program beginning in 2008 and through 2012. The Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Act (P.L. 112-141) reauthorized full funding for the program for 2013. After sequestration mandated in the Budget Control Act of 2011 (P.L. 112-25), approximately 1,900 local jurisdictions received a total of \$399.8 million in PILT payments this year. The Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act does not allow for sequestered funds to become available in subsequent years, because these funds are derived from the General Fund of the U.S. Treasury.

For 2013, your county is entitled to a PILT payment of \$537.00. If current bank routing and account numbers for your county have been provided to our Interior Business Center office or to SAM (System of Awards Management), an electronic funds transfer will post to your account on or about June 13, 2013. If this information has not been received, a check will be mailed to your county's address of record from the U.S. Treasury. Should you require further information, points of contact are provided in the list of Frequently Asked Questions at [www.doi.gov/pilt](http://www.doi.gov/pilt). The website also includes information on how to register in SAM to expedite receipt of future PILT payments. Please contact (202) 513-7785 if you any questions.
