



I would like to thank you for your previous support in the restoration of the Woman's Club Historic Mansion. Without your monetary help there would not be a Thomas & Annie Fleming House.

The commission has been a team player in this adventure. It has been one of the hardest restoration's I have worked on. The left side and the back of the house are being restored now. In checking the chimneys, all five of them have to be re-pointed, costing \$10,000 to repair all five of them. The left side of the porch concrete is broken and in need of repair. The ceilings in the Great Room has to be replastered. To be perfectly blunt it never ends. We have cleaned and re-cemented in the basement. A previous sewer problem was left with exposed dirt and broken cement. The best way to describe this house, everything was broken and had not received attention for years.

I believe we are seeing a light at the end of the tunnel but who knows, everytime I turn around it is something else. The good news is the community is enjoying the facility and are unaware of all the issues that confront us. We have held 22 events this year, and have made over \$6000.00. All help are volunteers and all food served is donated. We entertained a Tea with the portrayal of Mary Todd Lincoln to a sold out crowd. We entertained a recent Bus Tour from the Gettysburg, Pa. area. The Tour Guide did not leave time for a tour. They ate their lunch and loved the Mansion. The gentleman who scheduled the tour received an ear full. They were really taken with the beauty of the Mansion.

Grants we have received, in process now is a \$18,712. SHPO Grant that concludes July 30, 2013 when the left side and back of the house will be completed. We applied an received a Facade Grant from Main Street Fairmont for \$1000. We applied for a WV Development Grant for \$5000., which is still pending. We have completed and requested to be a 501-3C with the IRS, in is in process now. Believe me we do everything we can to pay our way and be frugal with our funds. We do not purchase luxury items.

With saying all of that, I would like to request \$5000.00 for continuing restoration. If you have any questions, please advise. We operate with complete transparency and integrity.



Dear Mr. Tennant:

Effective on or about September 4, 2013, Time Warner Cable ("TWC") will take another important step towards adding additional programming and improving Internet speeds by reclaiming bandwidth through providing existing programming in digital format only. In order to continue offering customers the advanced services they expect, we must continue our efforts to manage bandwidth utilization more efficiently. Since analog channels require up to 14 times more bandwidth than channels in digital format, we began the process several years ago of converting analog channels to digital-only format.

As part of this ongoing initiative, on or about September 4, 2013, Time Warner Cable will convert additional analog channels to digital format, including: C-SPAN, C-SPAN2, TV Guide Split Screen as well as Public, Education, and Government ("PEG") Access channels 18 and 19, which will now be carried in digital format on the Basic Service Tier ("BST").

At that time, the channels listed above will no longer be transmitted in analog format. We intend, however, to "channel map" these channels so that they will remain visible on their pre-existing channel numbers when accessed through a TWC-supplied digital set top box, a Digital Adapter ("DA") or a CableCARD equipped Unidirectional Digital Cable Product ("UDCP").

A majority of our customers have already participated in previous digital conversions. Those remaining customers not subscribing to digital services will need digital equipment – for example, a television equipped with a QAM tuner, a DA, or a CableCARD-equipped UDCP – to view these channels.

For the limited customers who do not already have digital equipment we will, upon request, offer DA(s) and remote control(s) in order that those customers may continue to have access to the PEG channels. Customers should contact TWC by **November 11, 2013** – to obtain DA(s) and remote control(s) at no cost until December 31, 2014. Beginning January 1, 2015 each adapter will cost \$0.99 cents per month. Just as is the case today, no customer will be required to subscribe to a tier higher than the BST in order to continue to view the PEG channels. I would ask that you or your designee contact me as soon as possible so that we can identify any equipment needs you may have in order to ensure a smooth transition for your account.

TWC will provide customers with at least 30 days advance written notice to make this change as seamless as possible. We would also like to enlist the help of the community's local access channel(s) to provide information to customers on this transition. As noted above, TWC will "channel map" the PEG channels so that they will continue to be found on existing channel numbers when a TWC-supplied digital set box, a DA or a CableCARD-equipped UDCP is used.

Customers using other devices to receive the digital channels, such as a digital television with a QAM tuner, will find the PEG channels as follows:⁷

- Community Access on channel 18 will be found on digital channel 95.1.
- Educational Access – on channel 19 will be found on channel 95.2.

⁷ The actual channel number displayed on your ClearQAM device may vary depending on that device's manufacturer and/or model number. In addition, it may be necessary to perform a new channel scan before you are able to view these channels. The procedure for performing a channel scan varies from device to device. If the customer experiences any difficulties, we recommend that the customer consult the manual that came with the ClearQAM device or contact the manufacturer directly.

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Commissioner Tennant added that the opening of the bids for the State building in Fairmont will take place today. He also stated that there will be a Movie in the Park this Friday.

Charlie Reese gave an update on the progress on the river front development by stating that MCPARC will be placing some picnic tables at palatine Park. Jeff Biafore with his crew is clearing the area of brush along with MCPARC'S equipment and people and Ted Offutt's Day Report crew is there as well. Charlie has and will continue to update the City of Fairmont with our progress. Charlie added that Dave Sago the Utility Manager is going to provide all of the utility maps so that we will know where all of the utilities are located. Charlie added that he will be meeting with both Thrasher Engineering and Frank Jezioro about support from the State Division of Natural Resources.

Chris McIntire stated that the previous Harrison County 911 Director Fred Smart has passed away today and that will be a great loss for all. He continued that he was very instrumental in Marion County's success with our program.

Commissioner VanGilder added that on the river front development project that we are not only using tax payer dollars but we are coordinating with all private enterprises in the area for their support and input.
